## A New School with a Traditional Ethos

For several years we have been working on a project to relocate the School to the St James' Park development zone in the south of Bishop's Stortford, less than half a mile to the south of our existing site.

Our aim is to provide a state of the art new learning environment for our students, whilst retaining the strong ethos and proud traditions that help make The Bishop's Stortford High School (TBSHS) Outstanding. It promises to be a fantastic site that combines high-quality teaching spaces and excellent enrichment facilities to support our superb extracurricular programme, as well as providing great facilities for the whole community. This move will enhance the Sixth Form experience further with an even larger Sixth Form area with more study and social spaces (including a Sixth Form Café and high spec IT facilities) with additional extra-curricular facilities such as a fitness studio. The project is being funded by the proceeds of the sale of our existing site, along with contributions from the DfE and local authorities. We also hope that our own fundraising efforts will help us to provide new equipment and further resources to really optimise the quality of experience for our students.

The Year 12 students who enrol in September 2022 will be the first sixth form cohort in our new school in Spring 2023. This move is very exciting as we look to combine all the exciting innovations in education with our traditional ethos. We hope you will become part of our first Year 12 in an exciting journey for the school and the Black and Gold Community.

### Welcome to our Sixth Form

Our Sixth Form provides a unique, dynamic, enjoyable and highly personalised experience that produces outstanding outcomes in the classroom and across all aspects of School life. We pride ourselves on a truly inclusive and outstanding all-round education, combining the importance of academic rigour with extensive opportunities outside the classroom, all delivered by a dedicated team of high-quality professionals.

Our Sixth Form provides a unique, dynamic, enjoyable and highly personalised experience that produces outstanding outcomes in the classroom and across all aspects of school life. In 2021, almost 40% of A-Level grades awarded were an A grade or above, and two-thirds of all grades were B grade or above; seven of our outgoing Year 13 cohort achieved places at Oxford or Cambridge University. Our impressive academic performances are just one factor of the fantastic education provided at The Bishop's Stortford High School Sixth Form as we ultimately pride ourselves on our 'Black and Gold spirit' which drives and inspires our community to do some truly exceptional things.

## Starting Sixth Form Life at TBSHS

We are a mixed Sixth Form with an intake of approximately 200 students into Year 12. On your first day in the Sixth Form, you will quickly discover that we are a diverse and welcoming community and that we prioritise your transition into our School. In fact, on your very first day in Year 12 the whole day is dedicated to team-building and establishing new friendships. Within one month of being at TBSHS, the whole year group will go on a "community and bonding trip" where Year 12 will complete a range of team building activities such as climbing, kayaking, paddle-boarding, whitewater rafting and raft building. We really value students who are willing to 'get stuck in' and we practise what we preach - you may end up rafting or kayaking with your tutors! These opportunities will help you to settle into Year 12 and enable you to become a valued member of a Year 12 tutor group. Ultimately, a happy student will always get the most out of their time inside and outside the classroom.

To help you deal with the challenge of A-Level study, Year 12 students are assigned dedicated Sixth Form study areas to ensure they make the most of our challenging curriculum. Our Tutorial Programme and Summer Bridging Units will further support your smooth transition from Year 11, and help you meet our high academic standards. Your tutor will meet with you regularly on a formal one-to-one basis to check on your progress and provide guidance in a non-judgmental environment for you to critically assess your own learning and development. Your Year 12 Tutors and the Sixth Form Management Team will also provide support in making any necessary improvements.

### What Should I Study in The Sixth Form?

We offer a great range of subjects and we would encourage you to choose the subjects which you enjoy the most and to play to your strengths, whilst also bearing in mind any career aspirations that you may already have. For example, if you wish to become a doctor you would need to study Chemistry and Biology. If you wish to become an engineer, studying Maths will be essential. However, if you are not sure what career path you wish to follow, select subjects that you enjoy or find interesting as we believe that our happiest students are our best performing and most motivated. Our own students are more than happy to share their reasons for selecting their subject combinations – so feel free to speak to them during our open evenings, guidance meetings and induction days.

When we come to create our timetable, we do our utmost to ensure that as many subject combinations as possible can be accommodated. To further enhance your curriculum, you will choose an Enhancement Option that is designed to prepare you for undergraduate study, leadership or employment. ## Teaching and Learning

You will be joining the Sixth Form in order to maximise your academic potential and we are passionate about helping you make this happen. The Sixth Form has three dedicated study areas, which all contain ICT facilities. Two of these areas are supervised silent study areas with the third area being a venue where quiet discussion can take place. Independent Study is a skill that we will help you to develop, as it will enable you to find success at Sixth Form and Higher Education.

You will find that your teachers will all be dedicated experts in their respective fields, sharing their knowledge with you through innovative and inspiring lessons. You will be encouraged to discover things for yourself and ask questions to deepen your learning. Subject teachers will stretch and challenge you and you are expected to work hard in return.

Our teaching staff will go that extra mile to support you outside of your lessons, meeting with you in study periods, at lunchtimes and after school to reinforce your learning.

On top of your A-Levels and BTEC studies, you will be given a choice of a curriculum enhancement option to broaden your CV and your independent study skills. You will be able to choose from:





 Core Maths – is an AS Level equivalent award, which enables students to increase their confidence in using mathematics to be better equipped for the mathematical demands of other courses, higher education and employment.

- Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme (Gold Award) is an internationally recognised award, which will give you skills, confidence and an edge over others when you apply for college, university or a job. You do not need to have done the Bronze Award to this option in Sixth Form.
- Extended Project Qualification is an AS Level equivalent award, which will help you to develop a range of extra study skills. It is highly valued by higher education institutions as it demonstrates your dedication to independent learning and is often included in offers made by institutions to applicants.
- Fundamentals of Finance Qualification allows students to develop essential knowledge of the financial services sector and commonly used financial products, such as shares, bonds and insurance and it will provide you with an understanding of financial terminology.
- Sports Leaders Qualification which will enhance your leadership and coaching skills. In this qualification, you will be given the opportunity to coach younger students within the school and in surrounding primary schools. It is a great qualification to demonstrate that you have used your 'soft skills' to great effect.
