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Whole School

We're very grateful to all those students who have continued to carry out home Covid tests, especially the important one prior to their return after the half-term break. We have a relatively small number of students self-isolating at present, but the case rate is particularly high in the local area, so we must continue to be vigilant and keep testing twice a week if we are to minimise the impact of the pandemic on our whole community.

We must continue to keep the school buildings and classrooms well ventilated, so as we head into the colder months, students are advised to make sure they are suitably dressed to cope with the cooler environment. We are utilising CO2 monitors to ensure we have suitable airflow in all rooms, which should mean we don't have windows open unnecessarily wide, but it would still be sensible for students to wear a vest or appropriate v-necked jumper as part of their school uniform, to help keep them warm.

School closure on Friday 26th November 2021

As part of the planned Platinum Jubilee celebrations, there have been some changes to the official dates for bank holidays in the summer term. Rather than having a bank holiday on Monday during the May half-term, Thursday 2nd June and Friday 3rd June 2022 will both be public holidays. As these days both fall outside of term time, the Department for Education have asked schools to reduce their academic year by one day. Therefore, **The Bishop's Stortford High School will be closed to students and staff on Friday 26th November 2021**.

Coronavirus - Asymptomatic Home Testing

Testing remains important in reducing the risk of transmission of infection within schools. All students have been given home Lateral Flow Device (LFD) testing kits and we encourage them to take a home LFD twice weekly before school on Monday (or Sunday evening) and Thursday (or Wednesday evening).

The current guidelines suggest that this advice will be in place for the foreseeable future, dependent on the circumstances prevalent at the time.

Students who have contracted COVID-19 do not need to undertake Lateral Flow tests for 90 days. However, if they do get COVID-19 symptoms, you should immediately book a PCR test.

Coronavirus - When to book a PCR test

Anyone with a positive LFD test result and/or who is displaying symptoms of Covid19 will need to:

- self-isolate in line with the stay at home guidance
- book a further test (a lab-based polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test) to confirm the result



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Whilst awaiting the PCR result, the individual should continue to self-isolate. If the PCR test is taken within the 2 days following the positive LFD result, and is negative, it overrides the self-test LFD test and students can return to school as long as they don't have COVID-19 symptoms.

Please complete the following form <u>Covid19 Reporting</u> online if your son/daughter has tested positive. Although the school is not currently responsible for track and trace, the Local Authority are still tracking cases in schools and are asking for this information. If you do not have the PCR test result when you are completing the form, please complete the <u>PCR Update form</u> when you receive the test result.

Positive result - If a student has a positive result from a PCR test, they should self-isolate immediately and continue to isolate for at least 10 days. NHS Test and Trace should contact you or your son/daughter and advise on the isolation period. Close contacts and everyone in the household or support bubble will also be advised to book a PCR test.

If your son/daughter is isolating but well enough, please ask them to check Satchel1/Show My Homework for work that will be set by their teachers. You do not need to update absence reporting unless your son/daughter is not fit to return at the end of their isolation period

If your son/daughter receives a positive PCR result, please **DO NOT take any LFD or PCR tests for 90 days** as this may return a false positive resulting in a further mandatory period of isolation.

Negative result - Where a student has a negative result from a PCR test, it means the test did not find coronavirus (COVID-19) and they can return to school.

From Monday 16th August, people who are double jabbed or aged under 18 are no longer legally required to self-isolate if they are identified as a close contact of a positive COVID-19 case. If a student is advised to obtain a PCR test as a close contact, they do not need to isolate whilst waiting for the results **unless they are showing symptoms**.

Free School Meals

Did you know that Hertfordshire County Council could save you over £450 every year? Your child could get a free school meal, worth over £450 per child per year if you receive any of the following:

Your child can get a free school meal if you receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (as long as you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and you don't get more than **£16,190** a year)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit (with annual earned income of no more than £7,400 after tax and not including any benefits you get).



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Apply today if you receive any of these benefits. It takes **5 mins** and in most cases we can tell you straightaway if your child can get free meals at school.

Have your National Insurance number or Home Office number to hand when you apply. If your child is eligible for free school meals, they'll remain eligible until March 2023, or until they finish their current phase of schooling (primary or secondary), if that's after the end of March 2023.

The benefits of applying online include:

- It's quick and easy to do most online applications take about five minutes to complete. Please make sure you have your national insurance number to hand.
- It can be done whenever it suits you, with no need for face-to-face or telephone contact
- In most cases, you won't have to provide paper proof of benefit
- You won't have to reapply for free school meals every year
- Your child will get their free school meals without delay
- You can apply for other benefits that you may qualify for at the same time

School Catering

Meal Prices and Menus: The price of a standard 2-course meal is £2.75, menus are available on the TBSHS website. The school currently offers break and lunch options.

The school has an upper limit of £6 on the amount of money that can be spent in one day. This will mean that your child cannot buy excessive amounts of food that may be being passed on to others. If you would like this amount changed, please call the school or email <u>finance@tbshs.org</u> to amend the amount up or down.

As I am sure that you are aware, there are a number of logistical issues affecting availability and deliveries, as a result, menus may change at short notice.

During the Covid-19 pandemic, the school will not be able to accept cash payments for any reason and the cash loader in school will not be active. If you are unable to utilise ParentPay, please ensure that you contact



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the finance department (<u>finance@tbshs.org</u> Tel: 01279 869521). Your assistance in keeping the school cash free is appreciated.

Please ensure that your child always has sufficient funds on their accounts for lunch as overdrafts will not be available. Any parent/guardian in financial difficulty should contact the school.

Breakfast Service

Some students have even received offers from all their choices and they are reminded that they do not need to take any action at this stage. In fact, we would strongly advise that they do not - Firm and Insurance choices will not have to be made until **9th June 2022** so there is plenty of time to focus on A level work, the mock exams in January and other assessments to inform their final choices.

For those students whose application was **not** PAY/SUBMITTED before half term for whatever reason, it is now down to them to drive the final processing to ensure it is sent before the end of term as we will not be checking and chasing them. Illness or Injury re: Participation in P.E. and Games lessons

Please can you refer to and follow the procedures described below in the event of your child not being able to participate in PE or Games due to illness or injury.

- Please provide your child with a signed and dated hard copy note (hand written or word processed) that they can keep in their blazer pocket to show to the member of staff. This note should explain the reason for non-participation and have an approximate timescale of absence. This is due to it not always being practical for PE staff to always be checking emails or due to receiving them several days before the lesson.
- 2. Please ensure you child still brings their PE kit, ideally with one of the TBSHS warm up tops or ¼ zip tops to stay warm and dry. This is for a number of reasons;



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- A) Depending on the severity of the issue they may still be able to access the curriculum in an adapted format (such as a non-contact or non-running format).
- B) If the severity is such that no adapted physical involvement can occur they can still take part as an umpire, referee, time-keeper, scorer or coach.
- C) We also have the option for students to continue rehab in the gym be doing cycling, stretching or exercises from their physio.
- D) The only exception to this is if the student has a broken limb or an injury where changing would be inhibited due to the severity of the injury.

It is a legal requirement for your child to participate in physical activity in school and we are careful with managing overuse, however there seems to be an increasing number of students who not doing PE because they're 'saving themselves for a big game on Sunday'. We get very few injuries in PE lessons and therefore students should be participating in some capacity in all lessons.



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The beautiful poppy grew amidst the service, suffering and sacrifice on Flanders Fields in Belgium and in Northern France in the First World War.

Shortly after losing a friend in Ypres, Belgium, in the First World War, Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae, a Canadian doctor, was moved by the sight of these poppies. This inspiration led him to write the poem 'In Flanders Fields'. It would inspire The Poppy Appeal, first started 100 years ago.

The poppy is a beautiful symbol of hope, inspiration, colour, positivity, resilience and respect. It remembers those that have suffered and sacrificed, and those who still suffer and sacrifice.

The poppy remembers those that have served and continue to serve. Service personnel and the emergency services have been, and continue to be, vital in the pandemic. Vitally too, the poppy also remembers the victims of terrorism.

In Christianity, the 2nd November is All Souls Day. This day remembers those who have passed away and whose inspiration, light, love and legacy is always with us.
