Final Assembly

Term will end around 12:30pm on Friday 17th December, following our whole school Final Assembly. Once again, it will take place virtually with students remaining in their form rooms, as it would not be appropriate to gather the whole school in the sports hall given the circumstances. We will use the occasion to celebrate the contributions and achievements of our students over the course of the autumn term.

Covid testing

Thank you to those parents who have already booked a slot for your child to receive their on-site Covid19 test on Tuesday 4th January 2022 (our INSET day). As a result of this mass testing, term will begin fully for all students on Wednesday 5th January 2022 safe in the knowledge that every student has been tested by a trained volunteer, thus helping to minimise the spread of infection at the start of the new term. To help further, do please remind your child to test at least twice a week using the home test kits provided.

Covid vaccinations

We have been told that the school age immunisation service (SAIS) will return to secondary schools to deliver a second vaccine dose to 12-15 year olds from 10th January 2022. As we were visited fairly early in the process for the first vaccine dose, we would expect SAIS to return to us at some point in mid-January. 12-15 year olds are eligible for their second dose 12 weeks after their first. Therefore, those students who received their first dose in school on 30th September 2021 will be eligible to receive their second dose any time after 23rd December 2021. Parents may choose to book their child an appointment at a vaccination centre or attend a walk-in clinic, if they would prefer not to wait for the SAIS visit.

Coronavirus - Asymptomatic Home Testing

Testing remains important in reducing the risk of transmission of infection within schools. All students have been given home Lateral Flow Device (LFD) testing kits and we encourage them to take a home LFD twice weekly before school on Monday (or Sunday evening) and Thursday (or Wednesday evening).

The current guidelines suggest that this advice will be in place for the foreseeable future, dependent on the circumstances prevalent at the time.

Students who have contracted COVID-19 do not need to undertake Lateral Flow tests for 90 days. However, if they do get COVID-19 symptoms, you should immediately book a PCR test.



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Please complete the following form <u>Covid19 Reporting</u> online if your son/daughter has tested positive on an LFD test and arrange a PCR test as soon as possible. Please complete the <u>PCR Update form</u> when you receive the test result.

COVID Mass Testing

A reminder to all parents to book a 5 minute appointment for **Tuesday 4**th **January** (staff INSET day) for your son/daughter to come into school for their COVID test. To book an appointment click on: https://tbshs.schoolcloud.co.uk/. If positive, the result will be communicated on the same day.

During the Christmas holidays, the twice weekly home testing will continue, which means students will be expected to carry out the home tests for the two week holiday.

The Following information has been taken from the Government website in order to help provide advice around the testing of your son/daughter.

Travel

All travellers arriving into the UK will need to isolate and get a PCR test by 'day two' after arrival. They may end their isolation once they receive a negative result. If the result is positive, they should continue to isolate and follow rules on isolation following a positive test. Unvaccinated arrivals aged over 18 will follow the existing, more onerous, testing and isolation regime. All Red list arrivals will enter quarantine.

Had COVID or tested positive

If you have tested positive by PCR for COVID-19, you will probably have developed some immunity to the disease. However, it cannot be guaranteed that everyone will develop immunity, or how long it will last. It is possible for PCR tests to remain positive for some time after COVID-19 infection.

If you have previously received a positive COVID-19 PCR test result, you are not usually advised to be re-tested within 90 days of this result. However, you should have a PCR test within 90 days of a previous positive PCR test if:

- you develop any new symptoms of COVID-19
- you are a close contact of someone who has been identified as a suspected or confirmed case of the Omicron variant of COVID-19
- you are required to take a PCR test upon entry into the UK

If you are tested within 90 days of a positive PCR test result for any of these 3 reasons, and the PCR test result is positive, you must stay at home, self-isolate and follow the steps in this guidance again.

If you have an LFD antigen test within 90 days of a previous positive COVID-19 PCR test, for example as part of a workplace or community testing programme, and the result of this test is positive, you and your household should self-isolate and follow the steps in this guidance again.

If it is more than 90 days since you tested positive by PCR for COVID-19, and you have new symptoms of COVID-19, or a positive LFD antigen or PCR test, follow the steps in this guidance again.

Have Symptoms

If you have COVID-19 <u>symptoms</u> you should stay at home and self-isolate immediately. You should <u>arrange to have a PCR test</u> as soon as possible. If this PCR test result is positive, you must continue to self-isolate.



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If you do not have COVID-19 symptoms, but you have a positive PCR test result, you must stay at home and self-isolate.

If you live in the same household as someone with COVID-19, you must stay at home and self-isolate if you are not fully vaccinated or if they have been identified as a suspected or confirmed case of the Omicron variant of COVID-19.

If you live in the same household as someone with COVID-19 that has not been identified as a suspected or confirmed case of the Omicron variant, and you are fully vaccinated or aged under 18 years and 6 months, you are not required to self-isolate.

Free School Meals

Your child could get a free school meal, worth over £450 per child per year if you receive some benefits. Full details and the online application can be found at

Have your National Insurance number or Home Office number to hand when you apply.

If your child is eligible for free school meals, they'll remain eligible until March 2023, or until they finish their current phase of schooling (primary or secondary), if that's after the end of March 2023.

The exam contingency date for the summer 2022 exams is Wednesday 29th June. All students must be available to sit exams up to and including this date. Therefore please ensure that any holidays are booked <u>after</u> 29th June.

Adverse Weather Conditions

In the event of adverse weather conditions we will endeavour to keep the school open as normal. In the very unlikely event that it is not safe to open this information will be sent to you via My Ed and published on the school's website and Twitter feed. In this situation we will move to remote learning via Microsoft Teams. If we do move to remote learning then students should check their school email for information on how to access their lessons.

Illness or Injury re: Participation in P.E. and Games lessons

Please can you refer to and follow the procedures described below in the event of your child not being able to participate in PE or Games due to illness or injury.

- 1. Please provide your child with a signed and dated hard copy note (hand written or word processed) that they can keep in their blazer pocket to show to the member of staff. This note should explain the reason for non-participation and have an approximate timescale of absence. This is due to it not always being practical for PE staff to always be checking emails or due to receiving them several days before the lesson.
- 2. Please ensure you child still brings their PE kit, ideally with one of the TBSHS warm up tops or ¼ zip tops to stay warm and dry. This is for a number of reasons;
 - A) Depending on the severity of the issue they may still be able to access the curriculum in an adapted format (such as a non-contact or non-running format).
 - B) If the severity is such that no adapted physical involvement can occur they can still take part as an umpire, referee, time-keeper, scorer or coach.
 - C) We also have the option for students to continue rehab in the gym be doing cycling, stretching or exercises from their physio.
 - D) The only exception to this is if the student has a broken limb or an injury where changing would be inhibited due to the severity of the injury.

It is a legal requirement for your child to participate in physical activity in school and we are careful with managing overuse, however there seems to be an increasing number of students who not doing PE because they're 'saving themselves for a big game on Sunday'. We get very few injuries in PE lessons and therefore students should be participating in some capacity in all lessons. Kind regards, **Peter Harris**
