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## Whole School

### Covid cases and face masks

Although we are expecting a review from Public Health Herts regarding their recommendation that face coverings be worn by students in lessons and in circulation, I would be surprised if they change that recommendation at this stage. In the last week or so, we have seen a slight increase in the number of our students testing positive for COVID19 and this reflects the increase in case rate both locally and nationally, so I think it unlikely they will recommend easing that restriction at this stage.

The NHS will be returning to the school on Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> November, to provide COVID19 vaccinations for those eligible students whom have not yet received one and would like to. If your child becomes eligible after this date, you can book an appointment at a local vaccination centre using this link: <u>https://nhs.uk/covid-vaccine-children or call 119</u>.

#### Online learning preparation

This week, we have begun to update our remote teaching tools, so that we could easily switch to online teaching at any point, should the need arise. In the event of an enforced closure this year, we should be in a position to continue with 'live' online teaching straight away. We will ensure students new to the school this year are familiar with the use of MS Teams, should we be faced with a 'snow day' this winter. **Mr Reeve, Headteacher** 

### School closure on Friday 26<sup>th</sup> November 2021

As part of the planned Platinum Jubilee celebrations, there have been some changes to the official dates for bank holidays in the summer term. Rather than having a bank holiday on Monday during the May half-term, Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> June and Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2022 will both be public holidays. As these days both fall outside of term time, the Department for Education have asked schools to reduce their academic year by one day. Therefore, **The Bishop's Stortford High School will be closed to students and staff on Friday 2<sup>cth</sup> November 2021**.

### Coronavirus - Asymptomatic Home Testing

Testing remains important in reducing the risk of transmission of infection within schools. All students have been given home Lateral Flow Device (LFD) testing kits and we encourage them to take a home LFD twice weekly before school on Monday (or Sunday evening) and Thursday (or Wednesday evening).

The current guidelines suggest that this advice will be in place for the foreseeable future, dependent on the circumstances prevalent at the time.

Students who have contracted COVID-19 do not need to undertake Lateral Flow tests for 90 days. However, if they do get COVID-19 symptoms, you should immediately book a PCR test.

Please complete the following form <u>Covid19 Reporting</u> online if your son/daughter has tested positive on an LFD test and arrange a PCR test as soon as possible. Please complete the <u>PCR Update form</u> when you receive the test result.



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### Free School Meals

Your child could get a free school meal, worth over £450 per child per year if you receive some benefits. Full details and the online application can be found at

Have your National Insurance number or Home Office number to hand when you apply.

If your child is eligible for free school meals, they'll remain eligible until March 2023, or until they finish their current phase of schooling (primary or secondary), if that's after the end of March 2023.

### Year 13 Post-18 Update

**UCAS:** Four weeks after our main submission and there are now conditional offers of places to over 54% of all the different course choices submitted. Please remember that students who have received offers should not take any action at this stage as Firm and Insurance choices will not have to be made until **9<sup>th</sup> June 2022** so there is plenty of time to focus on A level work and the mock exams in January. The results of these, further assessments plus full reports issued Easter 2022 should all be used to inform their final choices.

**Apprenticeships:** A reminder that students need to be alert and proactive in seeking and applying for apprenticeships as there is no streamlined timeline or application process as with UCAS. ### Illness or Injury re: Participation in P.E. and Games lessons

Please can you refer to and follow the procedures described below in the event of your child not being able to participate in PE or Games due to illness or injury.

- Please provide your child with a signed and dated hard copy note (hand written or word processed) that they can keep in their blazer pocket to show to the member of staff. This note should explain the reason for non-participation and have an approximate timescale of absence. This is due to it not always being practical for PE staff to always be checking emails or due to receiving them several days before the lesson.
- 2. Please ensure you child still brings their PE kit, ideally with one of the TBSHS warm up tops or ¼ zip tops to stay warm and dry. This is for a number of reasons;
  - A) Depending on the severity of the issue they may still be able to access the curriculum in an adapted format (such as a non-contact or non-running format).



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- B) If the severity is such that no adapted physical involvement can occur they can still take part as an umpire, referee, time-keeper, scorer or coach.
- C) We also have the option for students to continue rehab in the gym be doing cycling, stretching or exercises from their physio.
- D) The only exception to this is if the student has a broken limb or an injury where changing would be inhibited due to the severity of the injury.

It is a legal requirement for your child to participate in physical activity in school and we are careful with managing overuse, however there seems to be an increasing number of students who not doing PE because they're 'saving themselves for a big game on Sunday'. We get very few injuries in PE lessons and therefore students should be participating in some capacity in all lessons.


