

- You must build in time to get your work done on a daily basis



The opportunity to see what career you might or might not be interested in working towards	The chance to experience an adult work environment	Try out new tasks and opportunities – meet new people from different backgrounds with different experiences
Record for your CV; post-16 and post- 18 applications eg college, university and jobs	Great boost to confidence and self- esteem and helps attainment in the classroom on return to school	Provides knowledge of the local job market and starts you on the road to building a network of contacts

Private Placements

- Private placements are placements you source through your own contacts
- Guarantees what your son does and avoids disappointment with regard to choices
- Employers must agree to a visit by a H & S Inspector to discuss insurance, appropriate tasks
- £11 fee to parents/carers if outside of Hertfordshire & immediate vicinity within Essex



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


