Following the successful courses held in recent years CU are holding another two-and-a-half-day residential programme for Year 11 and 12 students interested in applying to study Veterinary Medicine at Cambridge University. The course will take place on **Monday 3rd, Tuesday 4th and Wednesday 5th April 2023**. The programme will include visits to both the pre-clinical and clinical departments to give a taste of the course, insight into life at a Cambridge college, and a chance to meet staff and current students. Places will be limited to 130 on first-come-first-served basis.

A note from CU: it would be sensible to encourage only likely A/A*-grade candidates to attend. Please note that Chemistry A level (or equivalent) is mandatory, and we strongly recommend two other science subjects, normally Biology, Physics or Maths.

Non-course- specific programmes and events Astrophoria Foundation Year Oxford's Astrophoria Foundation Year is a one-year foundation programme for UK state school students with significant academic potential, who have experienced severe personal disadvantage and/or disrupted education which has resulted in them being unable to apply directly for an Oxford undergraduate degree programme. Students will apply for their chosen degree course with a foundation year (for example Materials Science with Foundation Year). During the foundation year they will follow one of the following courses:

- Foundation Year: Chemistry, Engineering and Materials Science (CEMS)
- Foundation Year: Humanities (in Classics, English, History, Theology)
- Foundation Year: Law
- Foundation Year: Philosophy, Politics and Economics (PPE)

Applicants to Astrophoria Foundation Year will submit their UCAS application in the January of the year of entry.
