At TBSHS we care for the health, safety, security and wellbeing of all students and staff. This incorporates the duty to safeguard all students from subjection to any form of harm, abuse or nuisance. At TBSHS, we ALL have a responsibility to safeguard children and ensure this duty is uncompromised at all times.

School therefore requires that ALL VISITORS (without exception) comply with the following procedures.

All visitors must:

- Sign in at reception on entry to the school.
- Wear a visitor or agency badge, keeping it visible at all times.
- Sign out at security and return the visitor badge on leaving the

Any visitor without a badge will be challenged.

Staff at TBSHS can be identified by a **blue** lanyard.



Visitors without a DBS check will be given a red lanyard and accompanied at all times.



Visitors who can prove they have a current DBS check will be given a green lanyard.


