1.1 Sixth Form Expectations Agreement

The Sixth Form Expectations Agreement is an important document that outlines the expectations and responsibilities of the pupil in accepting a place at TBSHS. 1.2 Sixth Form Dress Code

We expect our students to dress in a professional, formal and corporate manner, *i.e. what you would wear in a formal office environment*. **The standard of dress should be exemplary at all times and in cases of uncertainty the School's Interpretation is definitive**. Failure to adhere to our dress code will result in a sanction and any serious breaches of the Sixth Form Dress Code may result in a student being sent home.
