Why are mocks so important?

- Projected grades will be written on your application to 6th forms, colleges, or apprenticeships for them to make decisions about offering places. Your mock results heavily influence these.
- A 'trial run' for the real thing.
- In some subjects it may determine your suitability to sit either a foundation or higher paper.
- Gives you a strong indication as to what you are likely to achieve & how much (more) work you need to do.

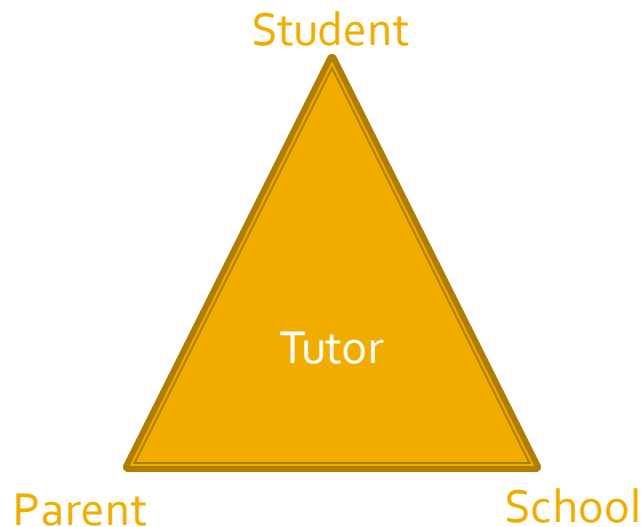
- Talk through concerns with someone you trust, good mental health supports successful learning and development.

Attendance

- **90%** attendance = **1/2 day** missed each week.
- **1 school year** at **90%** attendance = **4** whole weeks of lessons **missed (20 days)**.
- **90%** attendance over **5 years** of secondary school = **1/2** a school **year missed**.

Attendance

2021 GCSE exams

- Students achieving a level 5 – 9 in English & Maths average attendance 96.3%
- Students not achieving higher than a level 3 in English & Maths average attendance 91.1%
- Last year, the year 11 group attendance was the best in the school and well above national average.

TBSHS 6th form entry requirements in 2024

- ~~44~~ points from your best 8 GCSEs.
- At least a 5 in English Lang. Or Lit.
- At least a 5 in Maths.
- Meet specific entry requirements in chosen subjects. Usually 6s.
- BTEC plus one A-level option requires a minimum of 36 points.

Mobile Phones at TBSHS
