



Resilient Learners in Year 9

- Attendance come in despite minor ailments.
- Seek support before deadlines.
- Work away from mobile phone distractions.
- Self-motivation recognising the intrinsic value of tasks.
- Going beyond the minimum enjoying the challenge.
- Valuing and respecting the contributions of others dealing with difference.
- Attempting to solve problems independently.

Edulink One

- Students are expected to keep on top of their homework, to submit it on time and to meet the teacher's expectations.
- Failure to hand in homework will result in a 1 hour afterschool detention with the subject teacher.
- Afterschool detentions are non-negotiable. Failure to attend will result in a longer subject leader afterschool detention.
- Forgetting to bring homework is not an excuse
- Parents have a log-in



Homework in Year 9

- Support available in Homework Club.
 Two LSAs, after school every day.
- However students should not be attempting to complete all work at school.
- Avoid distractions at home.

Mobile Phones at TBSHS (Y7-11)

Mobile phones should not be seen or heard anywhere on the school site before or during school unless given specific permission by a member of staff.

At the end of the day, if you need to arrange to be picked up, you should not use your phone until out of the school building.

Mobile Phones at TBSHS (Y7-11)

- ► Failure to follow these rules will result in your mobile phone being confiscated until the end of the week or for your parent/carer to have to make an appointment to collect the phone no earlier than 24 hours after the confiscation.
- If confiscated on a Friday, the phone will be held until the following Monday

Parental Responsibility

Ensure students are prepared with the correct uniform and equipment: fully stocked pencil case, PE kit, DT apron, calculator, textbooks and exercise books.

Check Edulink: homework, achievement, behaviour, attendance and punctuality.

Check homework is completed to a high standard.

Parental Responsibility

Provide a quiet environment for home study.

▶ To encourage your son to take part in at least 2 extra-curricular clubs per week.

Ask your son what he has done during the school day.

Health matters.

Please ensure students receive a good nights sleep.

According to NHS, 14-16 year old children require 9 hours sleep per night.

"Evidence shows that night time sleep is just as important as healthy eating and exercise for children to develop. Those who don't get enough sleep are more likely to be overweight or obese. This is because they tend to crave and eat sugary or starchy food during the day to give them energy to stay awake."

- ▶ 2021 GCSE exams -
 - ► Student achieving a level 5 9 in English & Maths average attendance 96.3%
 - Students not achieving higher than a level 3 in English & Maths average attendance 91.1%


