Non-course- specific programmes and events

Astrophoria Foundation Year

Oxford's Astrophoria Foundation Year is a one-year foundation programme for UK state school students with significant academic potential, who have experienced severe personal disadvantage and/or disrupted education which has resulted in them being unable to apply directly for an Oxford undergraduate degree programme.

Students will apply for their chosen degree course with a foundation year (for example Materials Science with Foundation Year). During the foundation year they will follow one of the following courses:

Foundation Year: Chemistry, Engineering and Materials Science (CEMS)

Foundation Year: Humanities (in Classics, English, History, Theology)

Foundation Year: Law
