Government Economic Service Degree Apprenticeship

Following their stand at the recent Careers Forum, my contact in the Civil Service has dropped me a line to say that The Government Economic Service (GES) have announced that applications for their Degree Apprenticeship Scheme will open on Wednesday 13th December 2023 and close on Monday 12th February 2024. Students should start to submit applications at least two weeks before this closing date as there are multiple stages that need to be completed before 12th February. Students can find out more about the scheme as well as apply for the scheme (when it opens) here.

Students will be able to complete work experience in the Ministry of Justice or another participating central government department - students wishing to do their work experience in Defra should state this in Question 10 of their application form. Oxford's Astrophoria Foundation Year is a one-year foundation programme for UK state school students with significant academic potential, who have experienced severe personal disadvantage and/or disrupted education which has resulted in them being unable to apply directly for an Oxford undergraduate degree programme.

Students will apply for their chosen degree course with a foundation year (for example Materials Science with Foundation Year).

During the foundation year they will follow one of the following courses:

- Foundation Year: Chemistry, Engineering and Materials Science (CEMS)
- Foundation Year: Humanities (in Classics, English, History, Theology)
- Foundation Year: Law
- Foundation Year: Philosophy, Politics and Economics (PPE)

Applicants to our Astrophoria Foundation Year will submit their UCAS application in the January of the year of entry.
