Prospective Engineers

In 2020 a lecture was delivered by chief designer and Managing Director of *The Submergence Group of Cedar Park* in Texas, from the company base in Plymouth, Devon. The talk was about an unmanned autonomous ship called the MAS 400 which was to sail between Plymouth here and a destination in the USA guided only by AI and powered by solar energy in order to celebrate the 400th anniversary of the first Mayflower crossing. The original lecture was just before departure. This next lecture is a follow-up to hear what happened during the voyage.

The ship was equipped with a collection of instrumentation to make scientific experiments en route and to send the data back to the engineers on shore. More data is available on line if you Google MAS400.

At the recent Careers Evening, several showed an interest in engineering, hence my contact thought students might find the lecture of interest – to hear what happened as the ship set sail and the crossing itself. **Tune in on 5 December 2023 at 7.30 pm. The Zoom link is:**
