

MODULES/UNITS

AUTUMN TERM/SPRING TERM

Structures - Natural Forms

Students will be introduced to the course by developing more refined skills and methods introduced at KS3. They will explore of a wide range of techniques whilst observing natural forms including ink, acrylic, photography, pencil and oil pastel.

Students will create a sustained acrylic painting based on compositions of their choice, advancing their knowledge of working with acrylic paint, Colour theory and paint application. In the final stage of this project students will use their initial drawings of natural forms to create designs for a ceramic outcome which can be functional or purely decorative.

SPRING TERM

Structures – Amazing Architecture

Students will start to develop more independency during this project. After an initial introduction and some group activities and suggested artists students will develop the theme. Students will choose their own ideas, artists and inspirations. Students ideas will lead to an extended outcome completed as the year 10 exam.

SUMMER TERM

Reflections

Students will work from a specimen exam paper and develop work that is initially guided but becomes increasingly independent as they move into year 11.

This project will conclude with an outcome produced in timed conditions as part of the year 11 Mock exams.
