MODULES/UNITS

Component 1: Performing

- 30% of the qualification
- 60 marks
- Students perform for at least four minutes in total. This must include at least one solo and at least one ensemble performance.
- The ensemble performance must be at least one minute in duration.

Component 2: Composing

- 30% of the qualification
- 60 marks
- Students compose two compositions of at least three minutes combined duration.
- One composition is to a set brief, the other will be a free choice by the student.

Component 3: Appraising

- 1 hour and 45 minute exam.
- Course cover musical elements, contexts and language over four main areas of study.
- Students will be required to know their eight set-works in preparation for the exam. They will
 also need to be prepared to answer questions on previously unheard material from the areas
 of study.
