FINALS ADJUDICATOR – JOHN CAMERON

Composer, Conductor, Arranger and Lyricist



John has had a diverse and extensive career in music spanning various genres including rock, soul, jazz, classical, folk, ethnic, choral, and hip-hop. He began arranging for artists like Donovan and working on BBC Television shows before moving on to composing movie scores, with his first notable work being for Ken Loach's "Kes." His band CCS also enjoyed chart success during this time.

One of his significant achievements was arranging and conducting the concept album for "Les Misérables," which led to him writing the orchestral score for subsequent productions. He has also worked on other notable productions such as "Blondel," "Mutiny," and various versions of "Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat."

In addition to his theatre work, John has composed scores for numerous movies and TV shows, including "The Mirror Crack'd," "Hawks," and "Jack The Ripper." His recent projects include composing music for "Little House on The Prairie" and "The Path To 9/11," earning him an Emmy nomination.

John's recording work spans across different genres, collaborating with artists like Jose Carreras and Edward Higginbottom. He was also commissioned to write music for the musical "Nils' Wonderful Adventures," performed in Mandarin, which received acclaim in China.

Recently, there has been renewed interest in his earlier works, leading to the release of soundtracks and albums from the 70s. He even found himself as a co-writer of Logic's rap hit "Like Woah." Additionally, he has returned to writing concert music and has been involved in developing new musical theatre projects like "Hard Times" and "Ruth, the Musical."

Currently, John is working on a project set in the 1916 Dublin Rising titled "In Another Century," to be presented by Music Theatre students at the London College of Music. Amidst his busy schedule, his home-recorded jazz suite "Alone Together" can be found on YouTube.

Huey Levy - Percussion



I have always had a passion for music. From 6 years old I aspired to play the drums and It has gradually become a crucial part of my life. I started taking lessons at my primary school and as I got better and more confident in my playing, my parents arranged for lessons at Derosa Music in Bishop's Stortford.

Before I knew it, I found myself in Year 9 at The Bishop's Stortford High School, with a merit pass in my Grade 8 drums examination. I enjoy playing in the school's Swing Band and Concert Band as well as Percussion Club, which has massively improved my sight reading and technicality. I will be forever grateful that I was given the opportunity to take part in such advanced, impressive and prestigious music ensembles, as they have led to me being here this evening.

My favourite genres of music are; funk, jazz, soul and some pop. I feel these genres enable me to express my playing to its full potential. I look up to the likes of Buddy Rich, Stewart Copeland, Steve Gadd and Dave Weckl, always trying to incorporate some of their techniques into my own unique way of playing the drums.

Samuel Creecy – Brass



My interest in music began at the age of four when I attended the kindergarten music course at the Junior Guildhall School of Music and Drama in London on Saturdays. At the end of the 2-year course, my parents were looking forward to having their Saturdays back, but I had other plans! I had been invited to take part in the newly opened Brass Training Programme and I decided to follow my cousin Owen Lee's footsteps and signed up for the trumpet. Seven years later, I have achieved grade 8, still go to the Guildhall and enjoy all the extracurricular music at TBSHS.

Henry Davis - Classical Guitar



At age 5 I was gifted a little red classical guitar for my birthday, about a year later I started classical guitar lessons at my primary school. However, it was not until I joined TBSHS in Year 7 that I began taking ABRSM grades. I am currently working towards my Grade 8 exam in a few weeks-time. At school, I am a member of the classical guitar ensemble which has led me to performing in various concerts.

Heitor Villa-Lobos was a Brazilian composer often regarded as the most important and successful composer of Latin America with his compositions combining Brazilian music with the art music of Europe. The Five Preludes represent the composer's last work for solo guitar, written in 1940. These Preludes do not constitute a single cycle and each one develops in its own individual way exploring a different stylistic principle. I will be performing Prelude No. 5, subtitled "Homenagem á Vida social" (Homage to Social Life) in the key of D major which was actually the second of the Preludes to be composed. Written in a 6/4 metre, this Prelude evokes the waltzes danced by the upper classes of Rio de Janeiro in a bygone age.

Evan Badcock - Woodwind



I remember the moment I knew I wanted to be a clarinettist. We were driving through central London after an exciting FunHarmonics concert from the London Philharmonic Orchestra. After the performance I had had the opportunity to play both a trumpet and clarinet which gave me a difficult decision, but I decided on the latter.

From the ages 7-11, I studied with Lisa Chandler before moving to Peter Foster. For the past 2 years, I have been studying with Sarah Lewington who has inspired me to really hone my skills. Upon joining TBSHS, I threw myself into any band or ensemble that would have me and soon picked up Saxophone and Piano enabling me to play even more. Since Year 7, my confidence to play and perform has grown massively for which I have the TBSHS music department to thank.

Outside of school I play in the Hertfordshire Schools Symphony Orchestra as well as taking part in London Youth Wind Band courses and I have recently applied to the Junior Guildhall program which will allow me to study clarinet with expert tutors and play with incredible young musicians. If I don't have a musical instrument in hand, you may find me in the pool playing water polo, cycling, or sailing.

I am incredibly excited to be performing for you tonight and I hope you too can enjoy the music that I love.

Tailin Liu - Piano



I started learning piano at the age of 6, and I managed to achieve grade 1 under the help of an old lady who was also a neighbour. However, due to the pandemic and her concerns for safety, she stopped teaching me and I attempted to work by myself to continue playing the piano. This continued until I finally achieved grade 8 distinction, after which I found a marvelous teacher, and I continue to study piano with her, working on my diplomas.

At autumn 2022, I picked up the violin and learnt online which I later found to be not very effective, and 2 months ago we found a violin teacher. I attend the sting ensemble every fortnight at school and participate in the summer and winter concerts to overcome my fear of performing in front of audiences.

Jemimah Jones - Voice

Tonight, I will be playing the first movement of Dmitri Shostakovich's first cello concerto. Written in 1959, this is the first of two cello concertos Shostakovich wrote for his friend, Mstislav Rostropovich. Shostakovich was one of the most important composers of the 20th century. He lived under very difficult circumstances during Stalin's regime, often being under threat of arrest, interrogation, prison, and death. There were even periods where his music was banned as it was seen to go against Soviet ideals.

This is an exciting, dramatic piece that I have wanted to play from a young age, and I am very happy to finally present it to you this evening.
