Imperial College, London Competition

The Faculty of Natural Sciences Science and Innovation Competition returns for the new academic year.

Open to teams of young people, Imperial welcome entries from schools, community and youth groups. There is no limit to the number of teams that can enter and <u>registration is now open.</u> There are four entry groups including: 11-14 years old (KS3), 14-16 (GCSE) and 16-18 (A-level) plus an Open Category for teams of mixed age groups.
