

Research STEM Placements 2025 - Open

Year 12 students are offered opportunities in industry, universities and at local organisations. By undertaking a placement the organisation hopes students will be inspired and motivated and help give them the skills and confidence they need to get a place at a top university or secure a career boosting apprenticeship. Students in their first year of post-16 science, technology, engineering and maths (including social and data sciences) courses should

apply. Please note: This scheme is aimed at students who come from low income families, or don't have a family history of going to university. To be eligible for a place on the programme, students must meet criteria: 5 GSCEs at level 5 or above, must be in year 12 of studies. They must also meet at least one of: Household income of £40,000 or Less and/or free school meals at anytime in the last 6 years, first in their family to attend Higher Education.
