For students of all ages with an interest in STEM. Imperial College's **Faculty of Natural Sciences Science and Innovation Competition** returns for the new academic year. Open to teams of young people of primary and secondary school age, they welcome entries from schools, community and youth groups. There is no limit to the number of teams that can enter and **registration is now open.** There are four entry groups:

4 – 11 years old (Primary)
