Finance Internship With NHS

HCT is taking part in this year's *NHS Finance Insights Placement Scheme* offering paid work experience to young people aged 18 plus, who are not planning to go to university and are from a lower income family (eligibility criteria is broad; see [their website](#) for details). Through the scheme a young person will gain a 12-month placement in a band 2 finance role, allowing them to develop new skills and gain on-the-job work experience. Once their placement has finished, candidates should feel well prepared to apply for opportunities in the NHS, including apprenticeships, and be confident in moving into professional working environments.
