Imperial Science in Medicine School Teams Prize 2025 For Years 12 - 13 interested in STEM

The National Heart & Lung Institute (NHLI), the British Heart Foundation's Centre of Research Excellence at Imperial and the Imperial NIHR Biomedical Research Centre invite UK sixth form students to enter the fifth annual Science in Medicine Teams prize 2025.

Who can enter? Any UK educational organisation with sixth form students. Collaborations with UK or international school partners are welcome.

Team details: Up to six students per team. A multidisciplinary approach is encouraged. One team per contest with five contests in total.

Prizes: £3000 - 1st, £2000 - 2nd and £1000 - 3rd. Prizes are intended to support science-related activities in schools. Winning teams will be offered online mentoring session with an academic.
