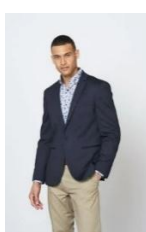


TBSHS Sixth Form Dress Code

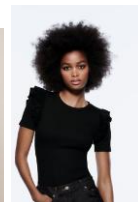

Item	Non-negotiables	Examples**
Formal business suit or formal trousers & suit jacket/blazer	Suit must NOT be linen	 H&M  Next  Next

Item	Non-negotiables	Examples**
Business style trousers, skirt or dress with a suit jacket or blazer	- Skirts/dresses <u>must be knee-length</u> - Skirts/dresses must NOT be lycra, eg bodycon style:	 Next  Lipsy  Asos

Black or brown formal shoes	- Must be plain or subtly patterned* - Midribs, shoulders and backs must be covered at all times & appropriate coverage afforded - NO strapless or "spaghetti string" straps 	 H&M  Asos  Zara
	- NO see-through or lace material - Jackets must be a structured jacket or blazer style - NO cardigans	 H&M  Asos  M&S
	Shoes must be flat or low-heeled	

- Shoes must be polishable

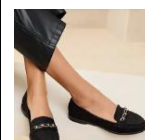

Optional Dress Code items

Item	Non-negotiables	Examples**
Jumper (optional, but must also be worn with a jacket)	• Jumper must NOT be sweatshirt material • Jumper must NOT be quarter zip ups  • Jumper must allow the school tie to be visible • Jumper must be fine weave only (NO fisherman style) • Jumper must be plain (black, blue, grey or similar)	  Next
Tights	• Tights must be plain, dark or natural colour	

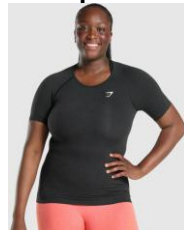
Dress Code for PE and Sport

Item	Non-negotiables
• A Level, BTEC Sport, Sports Leaders & Sixth Formers representing the school must wear specific TBSHS branded kit.	• As a privilege extended only to the Sixth Form, you may come to school on Wednesdays in sports clothing. But only if participating in an on-site Enrichment option and only if wearing TBSHS branded sports clothing. • If you do not wish to wear TBSHS branded clothing you must come to school in Sixth Form uniform before changing into PE kit.

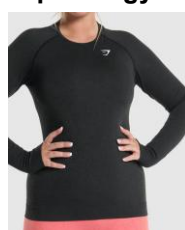

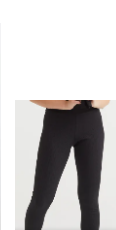

During Sixth Form Enrichment, students are expected to wear suitable and tasteful sporting attire

Hair and Make-up

Item	Non-negotiables
Hair must be neat and respectable with no extremes of style or colour. (In cases of uncertainty the school's interpretation is definitive)	• <i>Ideally, any hair which covers the eyes should be tied up. Students whose hair is not "neat and respectable" or may pose a health and safety risk is likely to be asked to tie their hair back.</i> • All long hair must be tied up for sport
Students should be clean-shaven at all times. We are very proud of the diversity of faiths and cultures in our Sixth Form and we will allow students to grow beards for religious observance. Please note that written permission from the school must be sought.	
'Natural look' day make-up is permitted	• Nail varnish must be well-maintained and plain/subtle in appearance.

Jewellery and Tattoos

It is illegal for anyone under the age of 18 to have a tattoo, even with parental consent. Tattoos must NOT be on show in school and MUST be covered at all times.

Students may wear a minimum of jewellery.	• Earrings must be discreet studs only • No other form of facial piercing, including nose/tongue/eyebrow studs, is allowed. Clear plastic 'plugs' may be used to keep existing*** piercings open. • Jewellery related to sincere religious observance may be worn.

Coats, gilets, hats and neck scarves should be placed in lockers at the start of the day and must **NOT** be worn in classrooms or whilst moving in or around school buildings.

Suit jackets/blazers must be worn at all times unless the Headteacher has permitted Summer Uniform.
